BRIDGE to BROADWAY - Ages 7-11

Students learn musical theater skills through rehearsing and performing a Junior Broadway musical! Classes consist of practicing songs, dances and scenes from the musical and participating in games and activities to learn about an actor's tools – voice, body and imagination. The session culminates in several January performances (dates TBD). This year's musical will be *The Jungle Book Kids!* This workshop is for students interested in theater, as everyone is expected to participate; please discuss this with your child prior to enrolling. Parents are required to contribute volunteer hours toward the final production.

Instructors: **Andrea Benson** has directed Bridge to Broadway productions for the last four years, has co-directed and taught classes at Hi-Liners Musical Theatre for over a decade, and heads The Bridge School's overall theater program. Her enthusiastic and innovative style is always popular with students of all ages.

Allison Gobat is a positive, resourceful teacher who teaches theater, music and creative classes at The Bridge School and Hi-Liners Musical Theatre. She has been the musical director for the past four years of Bridge to Broadway productions.

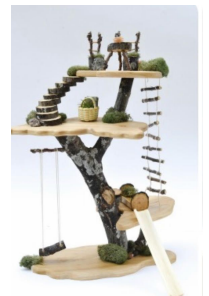

Students will learn safe and proper use of carefully selected woodworking tools as they collaborate on daily projects. This hands-on work builds creative, math and engineering skills as they problem-solve and learn basic construction techniques. Time is taken to build confidence and knowledge that can be taken into projects at home or future workshops. Student work will culminate in a final project of building an individual tree-inspired playhouse and accessories.

CEDAR PLAY SCHOOL - Ages 4-5*

Cedar Play School is once a week creative enrichment class for the youngest members our learning community. Your child will have their own special space to enjoy play through story-telling, art projects and hands on, imaginative exploration, movement, after which children feed their curiosity through sensory activities that connect with the season through natural materials and outdoor activity. Parents may be asked to help when we go on field trips or in other ways. Class size limited to ten.

Join Kat for jungle-themed fun! Activities include story time, songs, games, arts and crafts (and perhaps even cooking!) that incorporate jungle flora and fauna as well as imaginary creatures. We'll interweave studies of actual rain forests and jungles around the globe.

Instructor: **Kat Stein-Ross'** enthusiastic and engaging style works magic with all ages. She has taught Language Arts, Humanities, Health and exploratory arts in the US and Venezuela. Her favorite pastimes include cooking, reading, watching cooking shows, traveling and making up goofy song parodies with her two young kids.

SCIENCE ADVENTURES – Ages 6-8

Students explore many aspects of science in this hands-on, inquiry-based class. Each week we investigate a different scientific concept, including magnetism, chemical reactions, flight, biology, our senses, gravity, and much more. We'll practice the scientific method by incorporating hypotheses, observation, experimentation, and analysis into our weekly explorations. Each student will also choose a topic of personal interest to research and will create an info booklet about it with written and/or illustrated information.

THE TRAVELING TABLE - Ages 8-11

Each week, our junior chefs will explore the cuisine and culture of a different region or country. We will learn cooking skills such as general cooking safety, basic knife skills, measuring, sautéing, baking, blending, marinating, developing flavors, and more. Students will learn to follow a recipe (and perhaps even create one of their own!). Each week incorporates an exploration of cultural elements from a specific country or region and could include stories, folktales, music, film, art, architecture, or games. Students will also be mentored in responsible kitchen use (e.g. washing up dishes from our cooking projects) and open-mindedness (e.g. trying unfamiliar foods and flavors).

Recipes will not contain nuts and can be vegetarian; many will include gluten. Families with allergy concerns should contact instructor prior to registering to ensure class is appropriate for specific dietary needs. We use a shared kitchen no guarantees can be made about cross-contamination.

WORLD of DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY - Ages 8-11

Using the rule of thirds and depth of field, we will explore taking photographs that have compositional elements of professional photography. Students will learn how to manipulate and improve photos of people, animals and other everyday objects by exploring the use of light and by using a photography editing program to make simple edits. All participants will create a small book of images to record their work, as well as display one to two images at a Bridge School Student Showcase.

Each child will need the use a digital camera or smartphone camera to complete this course. If your child does not have access to a camera, please let us know and we will help locate one for this class.

This is an opportunity to develop skills through singing, dancing, theater games and art to bring the characters kids love to life! Students may work all together, in small groups and/or independently to accomplish their goals and ensure that each child is getting the attention needed to move forward and grow. This class will be most enjoyable for kids who like to sing, dance and work together as a part of a group.
